ARTHUR STEWART "Art" (1932-2023)



Founder of Jersey Ski Club Newark NJ Died at Age 91

A retired owner of A. Stewart Trucking in Paterson NJ, Art was a NJ National Guard member from 1948 to 1954. He belonged to Company B, 310th Anti-Aircraft Battalion, 372nd Group at Camp Edwards/Otis AFB, Cape Cod, MA. He transferred to Company A, 215th Armed Infantry Battalion, stationed at Camp Drum, NY. He joined the U.S. Power Squadron and was Captain of "Ethel's Art" his private boat. He was the first African American to join the Boy Scouts of America, Order of the Arrow in Bergen County. He served as Scout Master of Troop #10. Married to Ruth E (Cotton) Stewart

from 1952 to 1972, they had six children. He leaves a wife, Ethel (Brown Yearwood) Stewart, with whom he shared 43 years of cherished memories with a daughter, son, and stepson. Art departed life peacefully on June 3, 2023.
